

## What to Bring for Woodbe-Woodcut Workshop

**Students should bring their own carving tools.** At a minimum, each student should have a 3mm U-gouge, and a V-gouge. Tools can be purchased in kits, such as:

**The workshop price covers all other basic supplies**, including 3 'woodbe' plates, inks and papers. Additional paper may be purchased at the studio. The studio will supply ink rollers, X-acto knives, a large and a small etching press and other tools useful to the process to be shared in the group. (We will be using water washable soy based inks.)

### **Students should also bring:**

A design for a 6" x 8" image or just some sketches or photos of possible things like flowers or critters that interest you.

Optional items to bring:

Additional inks to use just for yourself

Other print papers that you like

Personal tools (e.g., barrens or hand-rollers) for your own use
